About the Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA) Program.

CNAs ensure the wellbeing of their patients by performing a variety of tasks that help with daily living activities such as feeding, bathing, dressing and other various hygiene practices. The CNA checks and monitors patient vital signs, safely turns and moves patients, and follows individualized patient care plans. CNAs typically spend more time with patients than nurses or doctors, they understand patient behaviors and health statuses.

What jobs does this program prepare me for?

Upon successful completion, students will take the California state CNA exam. This course also fulfills an entry requirement for the Vocational Nursing Program and articulates with Bakersfield College.
